Once she resigned as a Board Member in 2013, Kelly became a Big Sister to Mia who was struggling to make the transition from elementary school to junior high. She was “older than her years” and had a keen interest in art, but lacked self-confidence, suffered academically and had very few friends. Mia is now a Junior in high school and although she has transformed into a much more confident young lady, she still loves meeting her Big at the Beyond School Walls Program every other week. Mia is also looking toward a career centered around her artistic talents thanks to Kelly’s encouragement.

Matched with his Little, Tommy (not real name) since 2014, Chuck Neilsen was chosen as this year’s Big Brother of the Year. Unfortunately, Tommy, now 16, was removed from his parents due to substance abuse and custody was given to an aunt and uncle, who physically abused him. With no other living relatives, Tommy was placed in the foster care system at the age of three and has lived in various group homes. Chuck has traveled from Placerville to Eureka to Modesto in order to maintain their relationship. Tommy has a love for animals and the outdoors. Chuck has taken Tommy camping,

taught him to fish, and even shared his dog Tulo with him.
